Introduction

This is the 3rd edition of The Heatherwood and Wexham Park Hospitals NHS Foundation Trust Cancer Services Directory. It is a guide to the Cancer Services provided by Heatherwood and Wexham Park Hospitals NHS Foundation Trust.

The Directory includes a section for each cancer site, outlining the nature of the service provided, team members and contact details. It also includes information on other aspects of cancer services, for example the organisational arrangements for the Cancer Services in the Trust.

Overview

Demographic Information

Heatherwood and Wexham Park Hospitals NHS Foundation Trust ("the Trust") provides hospital services to a large and diverse population of more than 450,000 across East Berkshire and South Buckinghamshire. There are both rural and urban locations which include Ascot, Bracknell, Maidenhead, Slough and Windsor. The towns of Bracknell, Maidenhead, Slough and Windsor house two-thirds of the total population, the remaining third live in rural areas. Large areas of East Berkshire lie within designated 'Green Belt'.

There are approximately 30 languages spoken in the area, the top six of which are Hindi, Polish, Urdu, Somali, Romanian and Punjabi.

On the whole, the general health of people in the area is better than the England average. Priorities for the region include; childhood obesity, cardiovascular disease, early detection of dementia and falls prevention, early diagnosis of cancers including prostate, skin and colorectal and prevention and early detection of long-term conditions, heart disease and stroke.

Patients are referred to the Trust by GPs mainly in Berkshire, South Buckinghamshire, Hillingdon, North West Surrey and North East Hampshire.

The Hospitals

The Trust delivers medical, surgical and outpatient services from its two main sites, Heatherwood Hospital in Ascot and Wexham Park Hospital, 1.5 miles to the north of Slough.

The Trust also manages outpatient services at:

- King Edward VII Hospital in Windsor
- St. Mark's Hospital in Maidenhead
- Fitzwilliam House in Bracknell
- Chalfont St Giles Outpatients in Chalfont St Peter

In addition the Trust also runs a Breast Screening and Diagnostic service and a Chest Clinic at King Edward VII Hospital.

Wexham Park Hospital (600 beds) offers a range of services including general medicine, paediatrics, general surgery, vascular surgery, urology, orthopaedics, oncology, obstetrics and gynaecology, otolaryngology, oral surgery and a sub-regional plastic surgery unit. The hospital contains a range of facilities, including:

A&E department, supported by the Urgent Care Centre (UCC) Theatre complex Critical Intensive Therapy / High Dependency Unit Day surgery unit and short stay unit Coronary angiography suite and coronary care unit

Rehabilitation unit Maternity Diagnostic imaging including spiral CT scanner and MRI scanner suite State of the art Central Sterile Services Department (CSSD)

Heatherwood Hospital offers both inpatient and outpatient services, with facilities that include:

Orthopaedic day surgery unit
Minor Injuries Unit (MIU)(moving to Bracknell)
Children's centre
Theatres that include short-stay surgery unit, day surgery unit and endoscopy suite
Physiotherapy and occupational therapy
Diagnostics including MRI and CT scanner

There is a thriving Cancer Unit at the Trust, with Level 2 haematology, oncology and extensive outpatient chemotherapy facilities based at Wexham Park Hospital and King Edward VII Hospital. Diagnostic services include MRI and CT scanning facilities. Heatherwood and Wexham Park ("HWPH") Cancer Unit serves four Clinical Commissioning Groups (CCGs) and the hospital links primarily to three Cancer Centres based on existing patient flows and geographical distance: Oxford, Mount Vernon Hospital and Royal Berkshire Hospital.

The Trust is responsible for managing the East Berkshire breast screening service, which is based at the Parapet Unit, at King Edward VII Hospital in Windsor. The unit offers screening to women aged 50 – 70 where mammography screening is provided in line with national guidance.

Partnership working between the Trust and the newly formed CCGs has developed patient focused services such as the Asian Liaison Worker.

The Trust has the facilities to diagnose and treat many types of cancer with a wide range of services for both adults and young people, including specialist surgery, chemotherapy (drug therapy), haemato-oncology (cancer of the blood), and palliative and supportive care services

The Trust provides inpatient, day-case and outpatient services for cancer treatments. Where highly specialised treatments are required, patients are referred to the appropriate specialist centre, which is usually a recognised centre of excellence for that particular type of cancer and its treatment.

Clinical Oncologists:

The Trust currently employs two Clinical Oncologists and there are seven visiting Oncology Consultants who provide outpatient sessions at HWPH, together with regular attendance at Multidisciplinary Team (MDT) meetings.

Ward referrals to the Acute Oncology team will be seen within one working day during the daily, Monday to Friday, Acute Oncology ward round (see Acute Oncology Section, p6).

Each Tumour site is supported by Advanced Nurse Practitioners (ANPs) who perform the Clinical Nurse Specialist /key worker role. The ANPs are supported by collaborative links with Macmillan.

Provision of services:

Weekly tumour site specific outpatient clinics are currently provided at a number of sites: Wexham Park Hospital, Slough; Heatherwood Hospital, Ascot and King Edward VII Hospital in Windsor, St Mark's Hospital in Maidenhead, Chalfont and Gerrards Cross Hospital and Bracknell (Fitzwilliam House). E-prescribing (Varian Aria) for outpatient chemotherapy is fully embedded, and electronic ordering and reporting for both Pathology and Radiology (Sunquest ICE). Electronic access to Imaging (PACS) is established at all inpatient and outpatient sites.

Multi-disciplinary teams (MDT):

In accordance with what is considered to be best practice guidance (from the National Institute for Health and Care Excellence) and in accordance with national cancer quality measures, every patient diagnosed with a cancer will have their diagnosis and treatment plan discussed by a multi-disciplinary clinical team, also known as MDT. These teams meet to discuss every newly diagnosed patient on a regular basis and are made up of consultant surgeons and/or physicians, specialist nurses, consultant pathologists, consultant radiologists, allied heath professionals and administrative staff. There are regular site specific MDT meetings (the majority are weekly) covering Breast, Lung, Upper GI, Colorectal, Gynaecology, Skin, Urology, Head and Neck, Leukaemia, Lymphoma and Myeloma. Some tumour site MDT meetings are held in conjunction with other providers, with appropriate involvement for Specialist MDT meetings. There is a fully equipped Video-conferencing room in the Post Graduate Centre. All teams are supported by dedicated MDT coordinators and research trial nursing staff.

Each diagnosis of cancer is very different from the next, just as every patient will also have different and varied needs. Our aim is to ensure that each patient diagnosed with cancer receives care that is specific and tailored to them as an individual.

Chemotherapy Services:

Most patients receive chemotherapy as a Day Case on the Eden Unit at Wexham Park Hospital. There is a satellite chemotherapy unit at King Edward VII Hospital in the newly opened Ashford Suite. The chemotherapy service is currently under review with a plan to expand and refurbish the environment to improve patient experience. Inpatient Oncology and the Level 2 Clinical Haematology service is provided at Wexham Park Hospital in a purpose built unit with the use of up to seventeen inpatient beds on Eden Ward. The inpatient facilities are currently shared between haematology, palliative care and oncology, supported by each of their specialist nursing teams. Some patients may receive chemotherapy at The Bracknell Clinic.

Out of hours clinical on-call cover for inpatients is provided by the general medical junior doctors with access to oncology advice from oncologists at the Cancer Centres and on-call Haematology consultants.

Radiotherapy Services:

Mount Vernon Cancer Centre (MVCC) is the largest single site cancer centre in the south of England and along with the Berkshire Cancer Centre, provides Radiotherapy for our patients

At Mount Vernon there are nine linear accelerators (LINACs), two with on board imaging; two CT simulators with cone beam CT; two conventional simulators and the first NHS CyberKnife commissioned in the UK. Intensity Modulated Radiotherapy Treatment (IMRT) has been implemented for most tumour types. There is a High Dose Radiotherapy (HDR) and brachytherapy suite and an iodine seed implantation service, complete with an open bore MRI to assist in planning. Cross-sectional imaging is supplied by the renowned Paul Strickland Scanner Centre (PSSC) which has two PET-CTs; two MRIs (1.5 and 3T) and a state of the art CT scanner.

The Berkshire Cancer Centre (BCC) has a hub and spoke setup within Berkshire at the Royal Berkshire Hospital, Reading and the Royal Berkshire Bracknell Clinic (newly opened in 2011 and approximately a mile from Ascot Race Course). Between the two sites there are five linear accelerators (three with on board imaging), 2 CT simulators with cone beam CT; one conventional simulator and one superficial x-ray treatment unit. High dose rate brachytherapy and an iodine seed implantation service are performed in Reading. Cross-sectional imaging is with two 1.5 Tesla MRIs and two state of the art CT scanners. PET/CT scans can be performed at the Churchill Hospital, Oxford.

Acute Oncology Services (AOS)

The AOS service, established in 2012, has been implemented by the Trust to enable all patients admitted with cancer-related emergencies to be seen by an Oncology-trained senior clinician within 24 hours of admission. Patients who are admitted over the weekend will be seen by a member of the acute Oncology team on Monday morning. Acute oncology service spans all tumour types, treatment modalities and relevant services (chemotherapy, Radiotherapy). AOS brings together expertise of oncology, haematology, acute medical unit, radiology, palliative care and A+E staff.

The Acute Oncology service aims to:

- o Reduce unnecessary investigations
- o Ensure appropriate and timely referral to palliative care team
- o Manage patient expectation, reduce anxiety
- o Provide contact details pending follow up plan
- Meet needs of colleagues
- Reduce length of stay
- o Improve patients' experience

The service is for all:

- Patients presenting with side effects of systemic cancer treatment (Chemotherapy):
 - Neutropenic sepsis.
 - Uncontrolled nausea and vomiting.
 - Extravasation injury.
 - Acute hypersensitivity reactions including anaphylactic shock.
 - Complications associated with venous access devices.
 - Uncontrolled diarrhoea.
 - Uncontrolled mucositis.
 - Hypomagnesaemia.
- Patients presenting with side effects of Radiotherapy:
 - Acute skin reactions.
 - Uncontrolled nausea and vomiting.
 - Uncontrolled diarrhoea.
 - Uncontrolled mucositis.
 - Acute radiation pneumonitis.
 - Acute cerebral/other CNS, oedema.
- Patients presenting with emergencies caused by malignant disease (this includes previously known and unknown malignancy)
 - Pleural effusion.
 - Pericardial effusion.
 - Lymphangitis carcinomatosa.
 - Superior mediastinal obstruction syndrome, including superior vena caval obstruction.
 - · Abdominal ascites.
 - Hypercalcaemia.
 - Spinal cord compression including Malignant Spinal Cord Compression (MSCC).
 - Cerebral space occupying lesion(s).
 - Any other cases where the A&E staff or acute medical firm decide an urgent oncology assessment is needed.

One of the network AOS measures is that Health care professionals (defined as GPs, community nursing teams and hospital doctors) should have 24 hour access to Consultant Oncologist advice to obtain expert opinion on the management of an acutely unwell cancer patient (known or unknown to the service). In TVCN this service will be provided by the Oncologists in the two cancer centres:

- 1. Berkshire Cancer Centre:
 - Provide service for health professionals in the community and at the RBH & HWPH
 - Royal Berkshire provides this with a first on call service (which is a mixture of Oncology Specialist Registrars and Associate Specialists) with the Consultant Oncologists second on call.
- 2. The Cancer and Haematology Centre (Churchill Hospital): provides service to the rest of the network.
- 3. Mount Vernon Cancer Centre also provides 24 hour, 7 days a week Oncology services to HWPH Trust

Brain / CNS Cancer Services

The Trust Brain/CNS Cancer Lead is Dr John Wade

The Brian CNS oncology pathway is led by Dr Wade supported by the Acute Oncologists, Acute Oncology Advanced Nurse Practitioners, and the palliative care team.

Whilst patients may be cared for at HWPH the main treatment Centres are in Reading, at The Royal Berkshire Hospital, or some patients who may require MRI and/ or radiotherapy, Mount Vernon Hospital if more appropriate. The Acute Oncology Administrator tracks patients on this pathway ensuring the correct teams are involved in timely intervention.

Primary CNS tumours are referred to the MDT (Neurosurgery) meeting at Oxford (and occasionally Charing Cross Hospital) and are admitted for neurosurgery before being referred to the Oncologists.

Breast Cancer Services

The Trust Breast Cancer MDT Lead Clinician is Surgeon, Miss Dominika Predolac

The Trust Breast Cancer Service is based at The Parapet Breast Clinic which is in the grounds of King Edward VII Hospital in Windsor.

The service provides rapid access diagnostic clinics, and aims to see GP referrals within 14 days. Women diagnosed with breast cancer through the NHS screening will be referred directly to the Parapet symptomatic service. Surgical and Oncology clinics are held at The Parapet.

Surgery, including reconstructive surgery, takes place at Heatherwood Hospital (Ascot) and Wexham Park Hospital.

Patients needing Radiotherapy are seen at Mount Vernon or The Royal Berkshire Hospital Chemotherapy is administered in the Day Therapy Centre in the Eden Unit at Wexham Park Hospital or at The King Edward VII Hospital. Patients living in Bracknell may be able to have chemotherapy or radiotherapy treatments in the Royal Berkshire Bracknell Clinic.

Follow-up appointments are seen at The Parapet which also offers a lymphoedema service, prosthetics fitting and a family history taking service.

MDT Meetings: A weekly multi-disciplinary team meeting is held on Tuesdays at King Edward VII hospital starting at 7.45am. All new cases are discussed and individual treatment plans are agreed. The MDT is attended by representatives of all the professional disciplines including surgeons, oncologists, radiologists, pathologists and breast care nurses

Cancer of Unknown Primary

Carcinoma of Unknown Primary (CUP):

The term "cancer of unknown primary" refers to a condition in which a patient has metastatic malignancy without an identified primary source. This is a very heterogeneous disease in which the type of tumour, the extent of spread, and the outcome of treatment all vary widely.

Carcinoma of unknown primary team (CUP team) at HWPH Trust consists of:

- Dr Maher Hadaki (Consultant Oncologist and lead clinician)
- Dr Catherine Harris (Associate Specialist in Oncology)
- Jo Wilson (Palliative Care Nurse Consultant)
- Lesley Henderson (Advanced Nurse Practitioner and key worker)

The CUP team ensures that a management plan exists. This usually includes:

- Appropriate investigation
- Symptom control
- Access to psychological support
- Providing information.

How to refer patients to the CUP team:

- Outpatients with CUP should be referred to the CUP team using the rapid referral pathway for cancer. The CUP team will see these patients within 2 weeks of referral in the in outpatient session (Dr Hadaki, Monday or Wednesday afternoon)
- Inpatients will be assessed by the end of the next working day after referral is made to the CUP team.

MDT meetings: The CUPMDT is part of the upper GI MDT which is usually on Friday between 13:00 – 14:00. All new referrals will be discussed at the CUP MDT. The MDT team consists of: specialist nurses (UGI, CUP and palliative), admin, radiology, histopathology, UGI surgeons, oncologists and UGI physicians.

Colorectal Cancer Services

The Trust's Colorectal Cancer MDT lead is Mr Anil Desai, Consultant Surgeon.

All patients are seen in general surgical clinics - venue and time is dependent upon the relevant clinician. The colorectal team currently provides outpatient clinics at Wexham Park Hospital (Slough), King Edward VII (Windsor), St. Mark's (Maidenhead), and Fitzwilliam House (Bracknell). Oncology clinics for lower GI patients are held on Mondays, Wednesdays and Fridays at both Wexham Park and King Edward VII). Diagnostic imaging is provided at the radiology department at Heatherwood (Ascot), and at Wexham Park Hospital (Slough).

Sigmoidoscopy and colonoscopy investigations take place in the Lady Sobell Unit at Wexham Park Hospital, and Heatherwood Day Unit. Inpatient surgery takes place at Wexham Park Hospital

Chemotherapy is offered locally at the Ashford Suite in King Edward VII and Eden Unit at Wexham Park Hospital, Slough). Occasionally patients may need to attend the Cancer Centres at Hammersmith Hospital, Mount Vernon and Berkshire Cancer Centre, Reading. Patients needing Radiotherapy are treated at Mount Vernon or Berkshire Cancer Centre

Patients requiring resection of hepatic metastases are referred to the hepatobiliary team at the Hammersmith Hospital.

Patients with anal cancer are referred to Dr Gildersleve at the Royal Berkshire Hospital for treatment. Early rectal cancer may be referred to Oxford for local resection.

There are three full-time and one part-time Gastro-intestinal Advanced Nurse Practitioners (ANPs) who offer support and advice regarding treatment.

MDT meeting: The Colorectal Multidisciplinary Team meeting is held every Friday lunchtime between 12.00 – 13.00, and it is attended by Colorectal Surgeons, GI Physicians, Specialist Nurses, Pathologists, Radiologists and Oncologists and members of the Palliative Care Team

Gynaecological Cancer Services

The Trust Gynaecological Cancer MDT Lead is Mr P. Reginald, Consultant Gynaecologist.

The Trust Cancer Service provides gynaecological outpatient rapid access clinics, with slots for urgent suspected cancer referrals. Diagnostic imaging is provided at Wexham Park and Heatherwood hospitals. Patients requiring surgery are treated at Hammersmith Hospital or Watford, depending on the specific details of the surgery. Radiotherapy is given at Mount Vernon. Chemotherapy for gynaecological cancers is usually given in the Day Therapy Centre in the Eden Unit or at King Edward VII Hospital; however, patients receiving Chemo/Radiotherapy receive their chemotherapy at Mount Vernon.

A Gynaecology /Oncology Advanced Nurse Practitioner offers support and advice regarding treatment.

MDT meeting: The Gynaecological Cancer MDT meeting is held on Mondays and is attended by Gynaecologists, Oncologists, Histopathologist, Radiologists, specialist nurses and the clinical audit and effectiveness facilitator.

Haematology Cancer Services

The Trust Lead Clinician for the Haematology Multidisciplinary Team (MDT) is Dr Carolina Lahoz.

Within the team there are subspeciality leads:

Lymphoma: Dr Simon Moule Myeloma: Dr Mark Offer

Leukaemia and Intrathecal chemotherapy: Dr Nicki Philpott.

There are five Consultant Haematologists who provide a 24/7 on call service. They provide outpatient clinics at Wexham, Heatherwood, St Marks and Chalfont St Peter and at King Edward VII, Windsor. A weekly chemotherapy clinic takes place on Friday for patients receiving intravenous outpatient chemotherapy.

There are three Advanced Nurse Practitioners (one full-time and two part-time) whose role is to support and provide information to all haematology patients and their families/carers through their diagnostic and treatment pathway. They provide a weekly nurse led clinic for patients at Wexham Park Hospital, where Holistic Assessments and End of Treatment Care Plans are completed. They also provide a Help-line for patients, using the recognised UKONS Triage system, which is continued out of hours by the experienced nursing staff on Eden Ward who advise on urgent problems.

Haematology patients requiring specialist in-patient treatment and care are admitted to Eden Ward (Wexham Park). A full-time Haematology Registrar, part-time Haematology Staff Grade and a part-time Senior House Officer support this service. A formal Consultant ward round occurs on Friday afternoons; the ward is visited daily by the On Call Consultant Haematologist. Outpatients having intravenous chemotherapy attend the Eden Day Unit. Also within the Trust we have nominated Consultant Surgeons who perform surgical procedures and nominated Consultant Radiologists who perform interventional procedures under imaging guidance such as needle biopsies and insertion of long term central lines.

Patients who require radiotherapy are referred on the pathway to the Royal Berkshire Hospital under the care of Dr Joss Adams. Patients who need Peripheral Blood Stem Cell or Bone Marrow Transplantation are referred to Dr Tim Littlewood or Dr Andy Peniket at The Churchill Hospital in Oxford

Multi-Disciplinary Team (MDT) Meetings: There is a weekly haematology MDT on Friday mornings between 8:30 and 9:30am, at which all new patients are reviewed, progress during treatment and at the end of treatment is monitored, and any patients who have relapsed or present with new problems are discussed. In addition newly diagnosed or complex leukaemia patients are discussed in a regional MDT via tele-conference with Oxford, which occurs on a fortnightly basis.

Head and Neck and Oral Cancer Services

The Trust Head and Neck Cancer MDT Lead is Mr Stephen Wood, Consultant Thyroid/Head & Neck Surgeon.

The Trust provides weekly outpatient appointments for Head and Neck Services across the trust sites for the assessment of suspected cancers of the upper aerodigestive tract.

Patients presenting with a neck lump will be seen in the designated Lump in the Neck Clinic (LINC) at King Edward Hospital, Windsor on Monday afternoon from 14.00 -17.00. There are facilities to perform Ultrasound and Fine Needle Aspirations (FNA) of the neck and review by the Head and Neck cancer team.

All patients with a positive cancer diagnosis are discussed in the weekly Multidisciplinary Team Meeting, on Wednesdays at Mount Vernon hospital. The Wexham team attend the meeting with colleagues from Northwick Park video-conferencing into the discussion. It is chaired by a Mount Vernon oncologist. All new diagnoses, or patients with recurrence, are discussed and a treatment plan formalised. This is discussed with the patients in order that they can make an informed decision.

Diagnostic procedures, e.g., biopsies and thyroid lobectomies, are performed at Wexham Park Hospital under the care of a designated Head and Neck/ Oral Maxillofacial Surgeon. Other surgery is carried out at Northwick Park Hospital, or Royal Berkshire Hospital. Patients requiring radiotherapy and /or chemotherapy are referred to Mount Vernon Hospital or The Royal Berkshire Hospital, Reading, dependent on postcode and patient choice.

All patients are followed up in designated head and neck and Thyroid Clinics held on 1st,2nd and 3rd Tuesday of each month. This is attended by a Clinical Oncologist from Mount Vernon, a Head and Neck Consultant or Oral Maxillofacial Consultant and 2 Advanced Nurse Practitioners (Key Workers).

All patients are followed up by Speech Therapist and Dietician as appropriate

MDT Meeting: A multi-disciplinary meeting is held weekly on Wednesdays 8.30-10.30 at Mount Vernon. This meeting is attended by Oncologists, Head and Neck Consultants, Oral Maxillofacial Consultants, Histopathologists, Radiologists, Cytologists, Advanced Specialists Nurses, Dieticians, Speech and language Therapists and Nuclear medical staff

Lung Cancer Services

The Trust's Clinical Lead for lung is to be confirmed. The chest team are based in Windsor. They hold a multidisciplinary outpatient clinic every Tuesday on the King Edward VII Hospital site in Windsor (KEVII) for assessment and diagnosis and this is supported by an on site radiology department. Diagnostic imaging is carried out on the Heatherwood or Wexham Park sites.

A weekly bronchoscopy and interventional biopsy service at Wexham provides tissue diagnosis and once diagnosed patients will be treated with chemotherapy at KEVII or at the Eden Day Unit in Wexham Park. Radiotherapy is given at the Mount Vernon Cancer Centre in Northwood. The Wexham site also provides in-patient beds for patients needing admission. The Trust also operates a fast track system of referrals for suspicious chest x-rays which are coded as below and alert the secretaries from any radiology department in East Berkshire to fast track the referral to the Chest Clinic – see below

- FT1 .The appearances are suspicious for lung cancer and therefore a copy of the X-ray report is being fast-tracked to the Chest Clinic and faxed to the patient's GP
- FT2 The appearances are suspicious for TB and therefore a copy of the X-ray report is being referred to the Chest Clinic and the patient's GP
- FT3 If appropriate consider referral to the Chest Clinic. However, unless otherwise clinically indicated this is unlikely to be cancer so should not be sent via the urgent cancer central fax.

MDT Meeting: The lung multidisciplinary team (MDT) meet on Tuesday lunchtime between the morning oncology follow up clinic and afternoon MDT clinics to discuss all patients who have had recent investigations for lung cancer and to diagnose and plan their treatment. The MDT is made up of three Consultant Respiratory Physicians, a Consultant Thoracic Surgeon (from Harefield hospital) a Consultant Clinical Oncologist (from The Royal Berkshire Hospital) Consultant Radiologist, Consultant Histopathologist, Consultant in Palliative Care, Advanced Nurse Practioner, Associate Advanced Nurse Practitioner and MDT coordinator.

Paediatric Cancer Services

The Trust is a Level 2 Paediatric Oncology Shared Care Unit. (Level 2 POSCU). The Paediatric department is based at Wexham Park Hospital.

Predominantly, we share care with the Children's Hospital Oxford, which is our Principal Treatment Centre (PTC) within the Thames Valley Strategic Clinical Network (TVSCN). We also share care with other treatment centres outside of the TVSCN whenever required.

Local services at Wexham Park Hospital include:

- Inpatient supportive care including care of children with febrile neutropenia
- Outpatient supportive care
- Outpatient follow-up
- Outpatient oral chemotherapy
- Outpatient IV bolus chemotherapy
- Day care infusional chemotherapy

Structure of Services

The POSCU Lead Clinician is Dr Johanna Aspel, Consultant Paediatrician; the deputy lead is Dr Nicola Bienz, Consultant Haematologist. They are supported by a dedicated Specialty Doctor (Associate Specialist) in Paediatrics. The team provide services to children and their families with cancer, following confirmation of diagnosis and treatment plan at the PTC.

All children and parents are given the opportunity to discuss their diagnosis and treatment plan with the Paediatrician and Advanced Nurse Practitioner, Candida Hazard.

Weekly clinic

Patients on active treatment are reviewed every 1-2 weeks or in some cases monthly. Each visit includes a combined clinical consultation with both medical and nursing team members, with access to the specialist pharmacist in the clinic. Often the Clinical Psychologist is present in clinic.

Treatment is monitored, planned and administered in the clinic with supportive investigations and involvement of other team members as needed. Treatment is prescribed in the pre-clinic meeting.

Leave arrangements are co-ordinated to ensure that at least one of the main medical and nursing staff members is present each week.

Paediatric ward

Ward 24 and the Paediatric Assessment Unit provide facilities for planned admissions for chemotherapy and supportive care. This includes blood product support as well as emergency care for urgent complications such as febrile neutropenia.

These services are provided by the duty clinical teams under the supervision of members of the MDT as needed, with 24 hour access to consultant advice at tertiary level.

Home and school

Members of the community nursing team regularly provide school and home visits in order to perform investigations, administer treatments and provide advice and support. This ensures that the children and families are able to return to normal activities with minimal disruption.

Referral information

If a diagnosis of cancer is suspected in a child or young person who is in full time education the paediatric consultant of the week can be contacted through the hospital switchboard to discuss the case.

This will be discussed with Dr Aspel if available or with the haematology/oncology consultant of the week at the PTC. If out of hours the on call consultant in Oxford will be contacted. A management plan will be made with timely transfer to the Oxford unit as required arranged.

Referrals can also be made via the two week wait referral process; however a direct telephone call will result in a prompt outpatient review if appropriate, or it will be arranged for the child to come to the paediatric assessment unit the same day.

All patients referred with a possible diagnosis of cancer will be seen within 2 weeks with an aim to start treatment within a month of referral.

The patients referring GP should be notified of the patient's diagnosis within 24hrs of making the diagnosis, usually by telephone followed by written communication

Teenage and Young Adults (TYA)

HWPH is a designated TYA unit referring patients to the centre at Oxford where 16-24 year olds are discussed jointly in the TYA MDT and supported by CLIC Sargent social worker.

Locally, TYA is led by Dr Nicola Bienz and Jane Depledge Lead Cancer Nurse Consultant.

All ANPs and the local MDT leads within each of the tumour groups should notify TYA patients to a member of the local TYA team. This can be most easily achieved through direct discussion with the MDT co-ordinators' office. (see under each tumour site entry).

Sarcoma Oncology Services

The Lead Clinician for Sarcomas at the Trust is Dr Maher Hadaki, Clinical Oncologist.

The Trust is not a diagnostic centre for sarcoma and patients should be referred directly to the Nuffield Orthopaedic Centre (NOC) in Oxford either by the GP or by the trust's clinicians if a suspected bone or soft tissue malignancy.

Patients are referred to the sarcoma MDT at the Nuffield Orthopaedic Centre in Oxford. This is a combined soft tissue and bone sarcoma MDT dealing with all tumour locations (including retroperitoneal and pelvic sarcoma).

The MDT meets weekly Mondays 830-1030am at the NOC. Patients are added to the meeting via the MDT coordinator on 01865 738061.

Referrals with suspected sarcoma are directed to the Nuffield Orthopaedic centre in line with the NSSG TVCN Constitution dated August 2011. Patients presenting within specialities can join this pathway in line with their tumour site specific pathways.

Incidental findings via pathology reports should be referred immediately to the sarcoma MDT at the NOC for discussion, advice and/or to be seen by the team there. This does not apply to patients with Gastro-Intestinal Stromal Tumours (GIST) who are treated by the Upper GI MDT. Treatment is covered by the team at Hammersmith Hospital and presented by the visiting oncologist Dr Wasan, a core member of HWPH Upper GI MDT.

Gynaecology sarcomas continue on the Mount Vernon Cancer Network pathways and, following discussion at the SMDT, are treated at UCL

Skin Cancer Services

The Trust Skin Cancer Lead is Dr Fiona Lewis, Consultant Dermatologist

The Trust Skin Cancer Service provides outpatient appointments at Wexham Park and King Edward VII Hospital for the assessment of suspected skin cancers. There are three Consultant Dermatologists and two Consultant Plastic Surgeons dedicated to the treatment of patients with skin cancer.

Skin cancer referrals are seen urgently by a Consultant Dermatologist in clinics that run in parallel with a Consultant Plastic Surgeon. Biopsy and excision can be done in the Dermatology department but patients requiring more advanced surgery e.g. wider excision for melanoma are referred to the Plastic Surgery Department.

Patients requiring groin or axillary clearance are referred to Stoke Mandeville Hospital. Patients who require radiotherapy are referred to the Oncology Department at either The Royal Berkshire (Dr Ruth Davies) or to Mount Vernon (Dr Carrie Corner).

All follow up care for patients with treated skin cancers is provided by the dermatologists.

Local MDT Meetings are held every 1st and 3rd Mondays of the month Specialist MDT Meetings every 2nd and 4th Tuesday via video-conferencing with Buckinghamshire NHS Trust.

Upper GI Cancer Services

The Trust's Upper GI cancer MDT Lead is Dr Richard Sarsam, Consultant Gastroenterologist.

The Trust Cancer Service provides outpatient clinics at Wexham Park, King Edward VII, Skimped Hill and St Marks hospitals. Endoscopy, diagnostic imaging and ERCP investigations are at Wexham Park, with some endoscopy and imaging at Heatherwood Day Surgery Unit. Oesophageal and curative surgery for gastric cancer is performed at Royal Berkshire Hospital alongside the services of EUS and CPEX investigations.

Palliative gastric surgery is performed at Wexham Park. Hepato-billiary and pancreatic cancer patients are offered surgery with the relevant investigations of EUS and CPEX at the Hammersmith Hospital. Some Oncology and Trials treatments can also be offered there. Carcinoid tumour patients are referred to Dr Wasan at King Edward VII Oncology clinic with hepato-billary and pancreatic cancer patients.

Oesophageal and gastric cancer patients can access Oncology services at both Wexham Park and King Edward VII hospitals.

All CT and PET investigations are performed at Mount Vernon which is also the site for Radiotherapy and this can accommodate some inpatient treatment if required.

MDT Meeting: The Upper GI MDT meeting is held every Friday from 1pm and is attended by GI Surgeons, GI Physicians, Specialist Nurses, Pathologists, Radiologists and Oncologists. There is one upper GI Advanced Nurse Practitioner who can offer support and advice regarding treatment.

Urology Cancer Services

The lead for urological cancer is Mr Marc Laniado, who is a consultant urological surgeon. email:marc.laniado@nhs.net

The following services are offered:

Prostate cancer:

Men at risk of **prostate cancer** are evaluated in dedicated prostate cancer clinics at Heatherwood and Wexham Park directed by Omer Karim and Marc Laniado. Using risk calculators that go beyond just PSA and digital rectal examination including age, race, family history, prostate size and measures of inflammation, men are either discharged back to their GP or sent for a multiparametric MRI. If the mpMRI shows no cancer, they are discharged back to the GP, or, if cancer is likely, men are offered transrectal or transperineal template-guided prostate biopsies that are targeted to the abnormalities seen on the mpMRI.

Men diagnosed with prostate cancer are discussed in the local and specialist MDT, meet either an oncologist (Dr Nicola Dallas) or a surgeon (Mr Karim/ Mr Laniado), and spend time with the cancer nurse specialists in their own clinic before making definitive treatment decisions.

There is a large active monitoring/surveillance programme for men with low risk prostate cancer at Wexham Park. We offer nerve-sparing minimally-invasive prostatectomy (robotic) or focal therapy with HIFU at Wexham Park Hospital, or brachytherapy at the Royal Berkshire Hospital for men with medium risk prostate cancer. Men at higher risk are offered robotic radical prostatectomy with extended lymphadenectomy at Wexham Park or radical radiotherapy with androgen deprivation at the Royal Berkshire Hospital.

Haematuria 1-stop clinic:

In one day, men or women with haematuria receive a complete evaluation, so that they leave the clinic with a diagnosis and treatment plan. The investigations performed at Heatherwood on the day include CT urogram, flexible cystoscopy and urinalysis. The clinic is nurse-led and directed by Mr Motiwala and Mr Rao.

Patients with **bladder cancer** undergo transurethral resection of bladder tumours at Wexham Park or Heatherwood. Intravesical chemotherapy (BCG/mitomycin) is delivered at Heatherwood Hospital. High risk bladder cancer is treated either by radical cystecomy (open or robotic) with ileal conduit or neobladder by Mr Motiwala or Mr Rao at Wexham Park Hospital or by radiotherapy at the Royal Berkshire Hospital.

Patients with **kidney cancer** undergo either radical nephrectomy at Wexham Park by Hanif Motiwala (open) or Mr Laniado (laparoscopic) or partial nephrectomy by Mr Karim (robotic).

Penile cancer is treated by Mr Peter Malone at the Royal Berkshire Hospital in conjunction with University College London Hospital, as part of the supraregional penile MDT. Men with **testis cancer** undergo radical orchidectomies at Heatherwood or Wexham Park and then chemotherapy at The Royal Berkshire Hospital in conjunction with Oxford. Oxford acts as a supra-regional service for stem cell transplants.

Holistic Care: The Urology team works collaboratively with all agencies ensuring a seamless pathway of care. There are three Uro-Oncology cancer nurse specialists (One Advanced Nurse Practitioner, (ANP) and two Associate Nurse Practitioners), who offer support and advice regarding diagnosis, treatment, prognosis and also financial and social support. Patients are also offered a holistic assessment of their needs at key stages of their cancer journey. Extensive use is made of decision aids to help patients in their choices, with long periods of time allowed for interaction.

Mutlidisciplinary Team: The local multidisciplinary team meets every Wednesday morning and videoconferences with their counterparts at the Royal Berkshire Hospital. The team includes urological surgeons, oncologists, pathologists, radiologists, cancer nurse specialists, and coordinators.

Chemotherapy Services & Oncology Services

Chemotherapy Services are provided on the Eden Day Unit, Monday to Friday from 0800 – 1700. Supportive therapies are also offered such as IV bisphosphonates and antibody treatments. The Eden Day Unit team offers support to the Rheumatology team for chemotherapy and antibody infusional treatments. The team also offers telephone support to all chemotherapy patients. The Eden Day Unit also staffs a satellite oncology chemotherapy clinic at King Edward VII Hospital (Windsor) open on Tuesdays and Wednesdays from 0800 – 1700hrs. Haematology patients may attend for supportive care on a daily basis. Some Haematology treatments are provided as an inpatient on The Eden Ward.

A range of support and information is available for cancer patients, relatives, carers, health professionals and for anyone needing information about cancer.

The Information and Support Centre is supported by a Macmillan Cancer Information and Support Manager, an Information Assistant and Trust Volunteers.

This centre provides one to one support, financial advice for patients and families, Macmillan booklets, and leaflets related to other long term conditions

The Trust's medical and nursing teams have produced a wide range of written information for patients specific to the Trust. The information is given to patients when they attend the hospital. Service users are also signposted to national and local support agencies for advice and information. A DVD "Opening Doors" about the Trust's cancer services is being developed for patient information in 2014.

Living Well after cancer treatment

There are a number of ways to empower patients to manage their cancer experience. These include a full well being programme currently funded by Macmillan Cancer Support in collaboration with the Trust:

- Health and well-being programmes to provide education to patients on exercise, fatigue
 management, healthy diet, psychological issues, and use of complementary therapies,
 such as mindfulness, along with other subjects. A rolling programme is available for
 all patients and their immediate carers, either as a stand alone session, or to attend all
 eight sessions.
- Self management courses, such as the nationally recognised HOPE course Helping to Overcome Problems Effectively. These provide patients with tools to empower them to manage the issues facing them as a consequence of their illness. This will include goal setting, gratitude exercise, and relaxation and guided imagery.
- Support group a generic cancer group providing support while taking pleasure in patient- led activities. An opportunity for patients and carers to meet people who have gone through a similar pathway, to share experiences, feelings and concerns, and to take part in activities as a group.
- Physical Activity programme. In collaboration with the Council operated leisure services and other community bases, a eight week formalised exercise programme will be offered to patients, with the offer of a further 12 weeks at reduced cost for leisure centre activities. The aim it to ensure that physical activity, at whatever level, is part of patient recovery. Signposting to numerous forms of activity is available. This is now available to patients attending Heatherwood and Wexham Park Hospitals and the Royal Berkshire Hospital. The programme has been funded for two years by a grant from Macmillan Cancer Support.(December 2013 -2015)
- Referral for any aspect of the Well-Being programme can be self referral or via a health professional.

Support in the community

The Trust has established in collaboration with Macmillan Cancer Support:

Macmillan Cancer One to One Support:

This service offers people with Cancer advice and information to patients who require support within the community setting - during and after cancer treatment in 2 ways;

- 1. Telephone support can be offered to those with non-complex needs those needing further information or referral to other local services that can enable you to live your life to the full.
- 2. A face to face, home visit from the Complex Care Manager/Cancer Matron, for patients with complex needs in the community. For example support and help people with issues around emotional, physical and practical elements about getting back to living a fulfilled life. The Complex Care Manager/Cancer Matron is also available to discuss options and support GPs within East Berkshire.

Referral can be self referral or via a health professional. This service is for patients registered with a GP in East Berkshire only.
