


Preceptorship Programme

The study days are spread over the course of the year and Preceptees are supported in achieving clinical competencies.

The study days are delivered by the Clinical Education Team, Practice Development Nurses, Clinical Facilitators and subject matter experts.

A variety of interactive learning methods are used including discussion, group work, reflection, clinical scenarios, workshops, peer learning, e-learning and simulation.
