- Approve (or disapprove) significant transactions
- Attend Council of Governors meetings and joint meetings with the Board, participate in sub-committees and visit services regularly







COVID – Emergency Activity




Average Daily Attendances by Hours in ED






COVID – Impact

FHFT Covid Occupancy






What Next?



Planned Care

What have we seen?

- Reduction in referrals during each wave
- Lower reductions in second/third wave
- Reduced activity in diagnostics, outpatients and treatment leading to rising waiting lists
- Increase in patients opting to delay treatment
- Good recovery of suspected cancer referrals
- Lower ongoing level of GP referrals due to collaboration on pathways and reduction in avoidable referrals









Outpatient Activity





Operating Theatre Activity – Day Cases









Referrals Update referral criteria

•100% Triage

- Maximise use of Advice & Guidance
- All non-admitted to be reviewed for most efficient next step eg preoutpatient diagnostics



Diagnostics

 Radiology reopen Frimley to full use by 1/3/21

•Ensure FPH endoscopy fully returned as soon as possible

- Cardiac investigations in progress
- Maximise use of independent sector capacity for CT/MRI
- •Use of independent sector endoscopy capacity for Bowel cancer Screening and overdue planned series



Outpatients

- •Rooms stood up as soon as staff available
- •Minimum 3 x week room allocation group meetings
- Face to face only in full clinic rooms
- •Telephone/video in virtual spaces only
- Unused sessions offered out priority TWR/Urgent/T&O
- •All sites open by 1/3/21 except St Mark's and Chalfont
- Review community midwife allocation
- •Review OP prioritisation



urgery

 Booking in order of priority 2 then priority 3 longest waits then 52+ holding prioritisation

- Review green pathways including potential for minor ops FPH
- Continue minor ops FPH at present plus Heatherwood
- Restart theatres timeline
- Review urgent estates requirements plan
- Working with IS
