
Elements of critical reflection



- Select the event/experience/aspect of practice to be analysed
- Examine the reasons for actions taken, and the consequences
- Look at the experience from a variety of angles and different perspectives
- Draw on evidence, research, theory and professional knowledge
- Actively look for meaning and identify key insights from the experience
- Use your insights to make changes and do things differently in future

Gibbs' Reflective Cycle

Developed by Graham Gibbs and published in his 1988 book *Learning by Doing*



The What, So What, Now What? Model

What?


- What was the experience?
- What happened?
- What did you do?
- Who else was involved?

So what?

- What is the significance?
- How did you feel?
- Why did you react in this way?
- What influenced your feelings and reactions (e.g. past situations)?

Now what?

- What have you learnt from the experience?
- What would you do differently next time?
